Marcia Summers grew up in Southern Washington near Bonneville Dam. She developed a love of horses early on and had an intense desire to own one. Unfortunately, her sister had the same desire. Their father decided that there was only room for one horse and that horse was to belong to Marcia's sister. They say that all good things come to those who wait and that was the case in this instance because a few years later her sister went away to college and, at the age of 12, Marcia assumed ownership of said horse.

Marcia told me that she always had an interest in natural things and that she first started looking at rocks at her grade school. She noticed that some of them were green and later learned that this was copper. She told me, "If I saw something pretty, I would pick it up."

As a youngster, she was active in 4H and regularly entered things in the local county fair. Of course, the horse was a big part of that, but she was also extremely interested in sewing and cooking. Marcia attended Lewis and Clark College for a while and lived in Portland where she worked processing data. Later, she lived in Spokane. After relocating to the Wenatchee area, where she worked at the UPS Store. It was there that she met Carol Smith, who recently retired as the Ginkgo Mineral Society's President. This was around 2010. About 10 years ago, her partner, David Earhart, current Club Treasurer, decided he wanted to get involved in rockhounding. This sounded good to Marcia, so they began to attend Ginkgo Club meetings where she reconnected with Carol.

Among her favorite rocks and minerals are Petrified Wood, Crystals, Nodules found at Red Top, Ellensburg Blue and Montana Agates. She enjoys tumbling rocks, making cabochons, and wire wrapping. Most of the jewelry that she makes are necklaces but she has also wire wrapped a couple of rings. She loves to watch You Tube videos about rockhounding. Her favorite channels are Katy Did Rocks, Theo Kellison, Currently Rockhounding and Montana Rock Mom. If you haven't already, you should check these out.

I would be remiss if I didn't mention that she is the proud mother of two daughters, Lori who likes to fish and square dance and Sheri who is, like her Mom, a rockhound! Marcia has been and remains a tireless advocate for the Ginkgo Mineral Society and an active member of the club's leadership.
